Church & Cultural Challenges Hosts

Your hosts are apostle-prophet team Ps Norman and Barbara Miller co-founders of the Centre for International Reconciliation and Peace in 1997 and pastors of the Tabernacle of David Cairns. They have hosted over 20 conferences in Australia with 4 being in Parliament House Canberra. Norman is also an Aboriginal artist and Barbara, a sociologist, is the author of over 12 books including one on decrees.

From 2005 to 2011, they were the Australian and Bethany Gate (Asia Pacific) leaders of the Jerusalem House of Prayer for All Nations, taking teams to Israel each year. They currently facilitate the Indigenous Friends of Israel. They have had a strong focus on prayer, worship, & reconciliation and have ministered in Asia, Pacific, the UK & USA.



In 1974 Graham studied with Francis Schaeffer in L'Abri, Switzerland and founded the Orange Christian School in 1981. In 1986 Graham founded the National Alliance of Christian Leaders, later the Christian History Research website and the National Christian Heritage Sunday

He was foundation Chairman of Rhema FM in Orange NSW and a foundation director of the Vision Christian Media (VCM) radio network.

Ps Peter Walker is from the Bunjulung tribe from the Northern Rivers district of NSW. He is head of the Australian Indigenous Christian Ministries. He and his wife Maria have ministered widely.

He was the President of the Praise Corroboree, a major prayer and reconciliation event in Parliament House Canberra 1996-2001.

Ps Walker has successfully organised and led a 'Joel 2 Solemn Assembly' in Alice Springs in October 2016.
